

ROUND LAKE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING HELD JANUARY 20, 2010 IN THE VILLAGE COMMUNITY ROOM.

Mayor Sacks called the regular meeting of the Village Board to order at 7:00 p.m.

REPORTS

Superintendent Stevenson: informed the Village Board that there were two frozen water lines in the Village. The water usage at the pump house is getting better but it is still a little high.

Everything is good with the sewer.

The DPW crew is replacing the sheetrock on the ceiling of the village garage that has been damaged by water leaks.

Trustee Elford stated that he had a call from Joe Bradford, his neighbor on George Avenue. He was very thankful for the Superintendent coming down to his house on the weekend to look at his frozen water pipes. The pipes in his house were frozen, but Mr. Bradford really appreciated the Superintendent coming out on a Sunday to help.

Animal Control Officer: There are no complaints for this month.

Chief Mazza: there is a meeting on February 4, for the new county radio system Which they hope to have up and running in a few weeks. This meeting is to discuss the cost, and what will need to be done. Trustee Elford will be attending the meeting on behalf of the Village. Some discussion continued.

VILLAGE MAYOR: Mayor Sacks presented copies of the December trial balances. Mayor Sacks and the Village Board reviewed the document. Discussion included IRS penalties due to late payments; reimbursements from CHIPS, and the outside lights on the Auditorium.

Mayor Sacks informed the Board that her W-2 was in the amount of \$5,416 rather than \$5,000. The reason for this is that last pay period in December ended on Wednesday; checks were issued on Thursday. This increased the total paid to the Mayor more than the appropriation. The animal control officer's w-2 is also higher than the appropriation. Mayor Sacks had requested that they be corrected; they were not. Some discussion continued.

Trustee Nellissen will write the trustees page for the February newsletter.

Trustee Elford will write the trustees page for the March newsletter and Trustee Bergin will do the April newsletter.

The next budget workshop is scheduled for February 1, at 6:30 p.m.

VILLAGE TRUSTEES

Trustee Woerner commented that in planning for the spring, can we do something about planting grass seed in the triangular park by the Auditorium. Can we make this a no parking area? The Superintendent and Trustee Woerner continued a brief discussion.

Trustee Woerner asked if the old garages on Burlington Avenue could be designated as commercial, small retail district. It's something to think about, it would increase the revenue for the village. Some discussion continued about input from neighbors, traffic and parking.
